"New" Romans 6

Two Questions:

1. Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound?

Answer: Of course not!

A. Why are they asking this question?

Romans 5:20

B. Why is this not true? We are dead to sin! (6:2)

Death means separation, not the extinction of sin.

C. Our old selves died when we came to faith in Jesus Christ.

Two promises

1. Sin has lost its power over us and we are set free from the power of sin. (6:7, 14)

2. We will be raised to life as Christ was and we will live with Him. (6:5,8)

2. Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace?

Answer: Of course not!

A. I am to be a slave to righteousness, not to sin. (6:16)

B. The end result of being slaves to sin? Death.

C. The end result of being slaves to righteousness and God? Sanctification and eternal life.

He promises to give us wisdom if we ask (James 1:5).

He promises to provide a way out of temptation (1 Cor. 10:13).

He promises that our salvation is secure, no matter what (John 10:28–29).

He promises to never leave us nor forsake us (Heb. 13:5).

He promises to finish the good work he has begun in us (Phil. 1:6).

He promises to come back (Luke 12:40)
