-You have been weighed and found wanting! 5:25-27

## V. God's Judgement of sin is Final—5:30-31

"Then Belshazzar gave orders, and they clothed Daniel with purple and put a necklace of gold around his neck, and issued a proclamation concerning him that he now had authority as the third ruler in the kingdom. That same night Belshazzar the Chaldean king was slain. So Darius the Mede received the kingdom at about the age of sixty-two." 5:30-31

A. The sadness of remaining in charge

B. The certainty of destruction

*Life Group Study Notes The Handwriting on the Wall Daniel 5* 

1. What similarities can you see in the demise of the Babylonian Empire and the present course of our culture?

2. Belshazzar throws a party while under siege. How does this reveal his blindness to reality? Why are we all so prone to view ourselves as indestructible?

3. How do Belshazzar's actions mock God and His glory? Presently, what are other ways we implicitly mock God's glory?

4. How does God "write on our wall" and wake us up from the deception of sin?

5. What is the core lesson that Belshazzar failed to learn from his predecessor, Nebuchadnezzar?

6. Daniel is not impressed with Belshazzar's rewards. He knows they are truly temporal in every sense. How does temporal reward get in the way of our witness?

7. The finality of God's judgment of sin should cause us to repent. How do we slip into thinking that God's patience with our continuing sin won't be dealt with?
